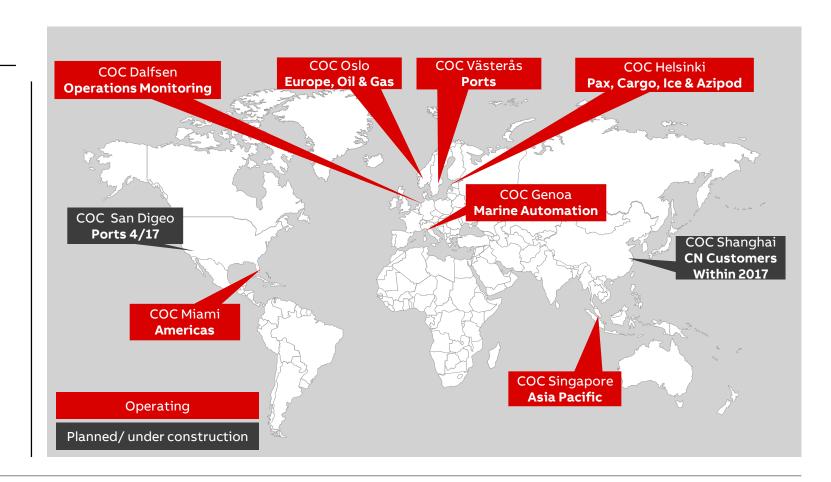
Collaborative Operations

All COCs can track technical support cases and ABB Marine and Ports can manage technical support questions in a true 24/7 manner – there is always an engineer on duty.

Wannacry Ransomware



Wannacry/ Wannacrypt

Overview

What is it?

Two part ransomware:

- Exploit: Infect & Propagate (SMB Worm)
- Encryptor: Downloaded after infection → Ransom Demand

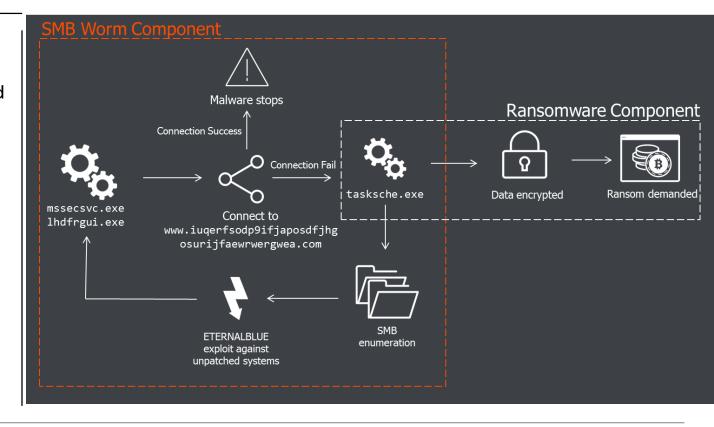
Primary infection vector unclear

Cryptoworm exploits SMB* on Windows machines.

On activation, encrypts files rendering them inaccessible.

Spreads through a network without user interaction

Ransom to decrypt via Bitcoin





Wannacry/ Wannacrypt

The Impact

Thought to affect between 200,000 to 3 million affected systems, however confirmed number two weeks after release was 727,000

Kaspersky reports "WannaCry reached over 9,500 unique ISP and/or organization IP WHOIS registrations, 8,900 cities, 90 countries with a measurable (1000+ uniques) impact, and some infection traces reaching virtually all countries worldwide."

Microsoft forced to issue emergency patches for obsolete systems (xP, 8 & Server 2003) in addition to March 14 patch (MS17-0101)

Traces back to EternalBlue & DoublePulsar exploit tools suspected to be developed by NSA and leaked publically in April

Impact on PCs depend on Windows Version.



Which Windows version

Wannacry infection tests

Remote Connection

Based on ABB Remote Access Platform (RAP)

Collaborative Operations Center

ABB Service organization for remote support

 <u>Layer 0</u>: Users launching the service center user interface in a web browser

Service center

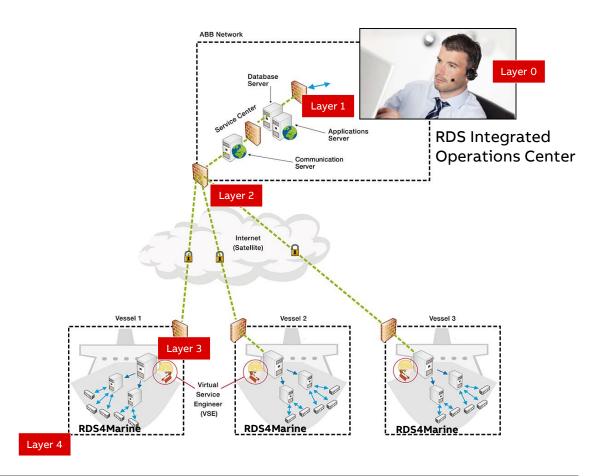
Web application server – the system core, control center and communication hub

- <u>Layer 1</u>: application and database servers residing in DB DMZ,
- <u>Layer 2</u>: communication server residing in web DMZ (accessible from the Internet)

Onboard monitoring

Monitoring and diagnostic solution, customer HMI and control center for remote activity

- <u>Layer 3</u>: virtual support engineer (VSE) residing at a customer facility (behind firewalls) and installed on RDS4Marine onboard infrastructure
- <u>Layer 4</u>: RDS4Marine diagnostic solutions that monitor ABB equipment used in the vessel's power plant chain





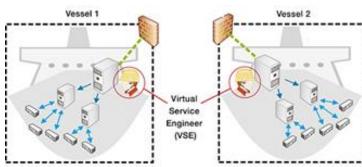

Remote Connection

Virtual Support Engineer (VSE)

Software package installed on board

- Acts as a software-site-manager
- Its main purpose is to set up a secure communication with the Service Center and signal its availability for a remote maintenance section.
- VSE will automatically contact the Service Center from anywhere in the world to make remote connection possible
- Allows Downstream (Remote) Patch Repository (installed in the Customer's network) to retrieve updates from the Upstream (Source) Patch Repository (installed in ABB).
- Windows Server Update Service (WSUS)
- ePO McAfee ePolicy and updates





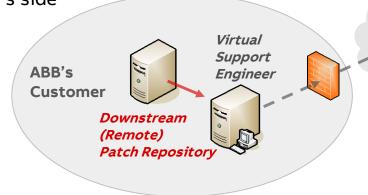

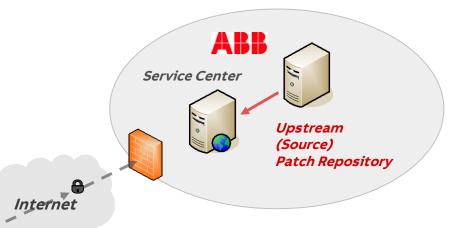
Remote Connection

Security Update Service in RAP - Overview

Utilizes Secure Connection between VSE and Service Center.

Does not require opening additional ports at the Customer's side





Allows Downstream (Remote) Patch Repository (installed in the Customer's network) to retrieve updates from the Upstream (Source) Patch Repository (installed in ABB)



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
